

Advisory with Extended Lunch & Loss of Privilege Program

The Orem High Advisory program is designed to help all students get one on one mentoring from their faculty advisor and allow them daily time for 25 minutes to do homework, get individual tutoring and to stay on top of current assignments. Students can also use this study period to remediate credits through the Orem High/East Shore High School Partnership program with packets from ESHS.

The Extended Lunch Program is designed to provide daily incentives to students by rewarding them for academic and attendance success.

- 1.) Advisory will be at the end of 3rd period and will be 25 minutes long. During that time the students will listen to the announcements for the first 3 to 6 minutes. Juniors and seniors who have a “C” or better in all classes and have no attendance concerns (NC’s) will be released after the announcements to enjoy an extended lunch.

Sophomores will be retained in class for study hall during the 1st Quarter.

For the 2nd Quarter those sophomores who are getting a “C” or better in all classes and have good attendance with no “NC’s” will have the opportunity to participate in the Extended Lunch program twice a month for the term.

During 3rd Quarter qualifying sophomores will be able to participate in the extended lunch program every Friday. For 4th Quarter sophomores will have extended lunch everyday if their grades and attendance are in compliance with this program.

At anytime a student’s grades fall below a “C” in any one of their classes or if they receive an “NC” due to attendance violations they will lose the privilege to participate in having extended lunch until the concerns are remediated.

The regular lunch period will continue to be 32 minutes long and there will be no extended lunch options on Mondays (Collaboration Days) or on days when we have assemblies.

- 2.) During the first 2 weeks of each semester *all* students, including juniors and seniors, will be retained in Advisory until accurate grades are posted upon which to base the rewards. During that time students are expected to study and/or listen to general information that will be presented.

During the first 2 Weeks of the 1st term, all students will be presented information regarding school rules, policies, programs, opportunities, academic support, school traditions, etc. This information will be presented by way of video clips that will go to all classrooms. All students must watch the videos and pass a test regarding the information in order to be allowed to participate in the extended lunch program. New students will have the opportunity to take the test, as well as

retakes for those not passing it previously. Spanish translation will be available for those who need it. The tests will be administered through UTIPS.

- 3.) A report in Powerschool will flag all students who are ineligible to go to extended lunch and the program will be updated on a daily basis to accommodate those who have remediated their behavior. The Administration has the right to assign an LOP (Loss of Privilege) to students for school policy and rule infractions.
- 4.) Teachers will have one week to input late work which might be submitted for remediation.

All passing periods will be 5 minutes.
